- Tell us exactly why you recommend this applicant for the Aerobatic Training Award.

ALL APPLICANTS

- Pilot certificate (both sides).
- Proof of pilot currency (logbook pages, instructor sign-off, or other appropriate documentation).
- Medical certificate as applicable.

APPLICANT INSTRUCTIONS

1. The IAC 34 Aerobatic Training Award provides an award of a minimum of \$500.00 toward aerobatic flight training in the state of Ohio. **Travel / food / lodging not included during training.**

2. Application must be submitted on paper and be neat and legible. It may be completed by computer, typewriter, or by hand. Indicate "N/A" for "not applicable." Use more space or attach extra page to relevant Part, if needed. When sending hardcopy via US mail we suggest printing double-sided to save paper and shipping costs.

3. Make an extra copy of your complete application and retain for your records.

4. Complete application package submission consists of the original of Application including photocopies of documentation. The applicant is responsible for ensuring that the submitted application package is complete in every respect. Staple or clip pages – do not use any type of binder or cover. Application may be accepted in email format by sending scanned documents via email to: gpenner@cinci.rr.com

5. Submit application package to IAC 34 Scholarship Committee as below **so that they will receive it by the deadline of November 1, 2009.** Send in a single, traceable shipment. Retain shipment tracking number and receipt.

INCOMPLETE or LATE applications will be DISQUALIFIED.

Suggestions that may strengthen your IAC 34 Aerobatic Training Award application:

- 1 Be an active International Aerobatic Club Member or EAA member.
- 2 Have a detailed plan for promoting Aerobatic flying to the aviation community.
- 3 If a high school or college student, provide transcripts showing high academic achievement.
